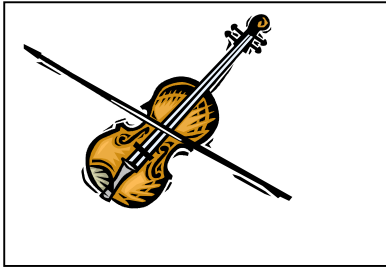
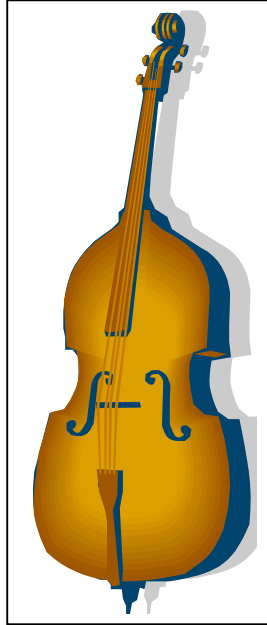
## Newsletter No 10: 14 th: March
